Chronic oedema and lymphoedema can often present with complex symptoms and coexisting polymorbidity. This article highlights the need for skilled practitioners, comprehensive patient assessment and access to a range of treatment options for optimal treatment outcomes.

Chronic oedema is considered complex if one or more of the following is present: significant obesity, recurrent cellulitis, concordance issues, progressing life-threatening / life-limiting disease, significant skin damage including wounds.

The growing numbers of older, obese and polymorbid patients are likely to

increase the burden on community nurses and lymphoedema practitioners.
