## Noreen Bidgood

Noreen was born 27 November 1928 in Devizes into a Salvation Army family. She was the youngest of four girls, all born in November. She left school at 14 and worked for four years during the war in the wages' office at Roundway Flax Mill, a government factory. She remembers the Italian and German POWs working there in the factory and the fields. She remembers the large wallchart in the office showing all the types of flax and qualities eg Grade One flax, which was like silk, went to Ireland for Irish linen and also for making parachutes. Noreen also worked for Maslens builder as a receptionist. She loved singing and dancing when she was young. "I had a very happy childhood, had a good life and am pleased to be still here enjoying myself. I love coming to Leg Club for the company."
