

Skin Tags

Skin tags are very common. They are simply extra little bits of skin-coloured tissue that hang off of the skin. They tend to be found in areas of friction. Most commonly the neck, armpits, under the bust line (bra-strap rub) and groin area. Daily friction against the skin can cause these pesky little tags to form.



Skin tags will not disappear on their own accord. Although usually small, they do have a blood supply and can grow to be quite large and fleshy. They can become a nuisance, being prone to catching on clothes and can become quite sore.

Sometimes skin tags can become infected.

The easiest and most effective way of removing skin tags of all sizes is to use Electrosurgery.

Without local anaesthetic, Electrosurgery will remove the skin tags, cauterising the blood supply.

Any remaining tissue will dry up and drop off over the following few days. On average this takes around five days.

Hence, The Whiteley Clinic has joined with The College of Phlebology to set up an International Venous Registry – the CoP Venous Registry. All patients with varicose veins and venous related conditions are included.

Over the years, doctors, clinics and hospitals who are part of the Venous Registry will be able to prove that they get good results for their patients.

However, many doctors, clinics and hospitals do not wish to join as they do not wish for their results to be monitored!

When choosing who should treat your veins, you should check whether they are an active member of the CoP Venous Registry. This will help you have confidence that all of their work is being scrutinised and patients can give long term feedback.

Doctors who are part of the CoP Venous Registry have the registry icon on their websites with an individual member

number, and a link to the College of Phlebology list of active members.

New book on pelvic pain and pelvic varicose veins

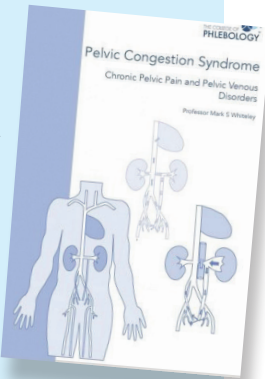
In October, Mark Whiteley published the first book, available on Amazon anywhere in the world, on Pelvic Congestion Syndrome arising from pelvic varicose veins.

Written primarily for patients and family doctors, *Pelvic Congestion Syndrome - Chronic Pelvic Pain and Pelvic Venous Disorders* explains pelvic varicose veins.

- 1 in 6 women with leg varicose veins actually have their varicose veins arising from pelvic veins.
- Between 500,000 and 1.5 million women in the UK have chronic pelvic pain due to pelvic congestion – but do not get diagnosed.

Unfortunately, in the UK, pelvic congestion is largely unrecognised. GPs and gynaecologists do not make this diagnosis. Women with chronic pelvic pain usually get told they have endometriosis or that there is nothing wrong with them.

As pelvic congestion is curable, and The Whiteley Clinic are recognised as leaders in this area, this book is long overdue. Hopefully enough people will read it to help the millions of patients with pelvic vein problems understand that there are now investigations and treatments available.



The new Rafaelo Procedure in London and Guildford is now available in Bristol

Haemorrhoids (piles) are basically varicose veins from the pelvis.

The Rafaelo treatment is a walk-in, walk-out cure for haemorrhoids. It is highly effective and, although nothing treating haemorrhoids is pain-free, it is much less painful than other treatment options.

Consultant colorectal surgeons, Mr Amyn Haji and Mr Simon Middleton



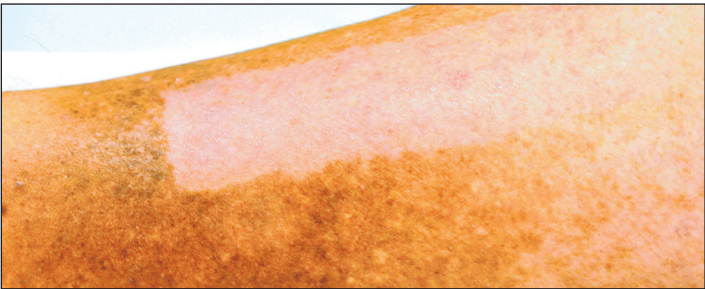
have been performing this procedure in our London and Guildford Clinics and, since September 2019, are now offering it to **Bristol** patients too.

Removing brown stains from the legs



BEFORE

Brown stains on the lower leg, or ankle, are usually caused by varicose veins or hidden varicose veins. The stain is called 'haemosiderin'. It may also be seen after a leg ulcer has healed or after sclerotherapy.

In 2018, Vicki Whiteley and Professor Mark Whiteley introduced a new technique into the UK to remove these leg stains. Once the underlying veins have been dealt with, the brown stains can be treated with a special laser. After treatment, scabs will develop, allowing new skin to grow back without the brown staining.

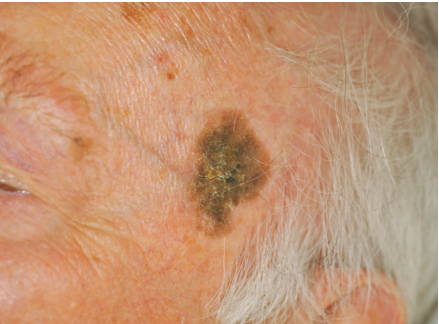
The scabbing usually lasts 7 – 12 days, with results being seen from 2 – 4 weeks onwards. Large patches of staining require a staged process over several sessions.

This technique is currently **exclusive** to The Whiteley Clinic in the UK and is currently only available at our Guildford clinic.

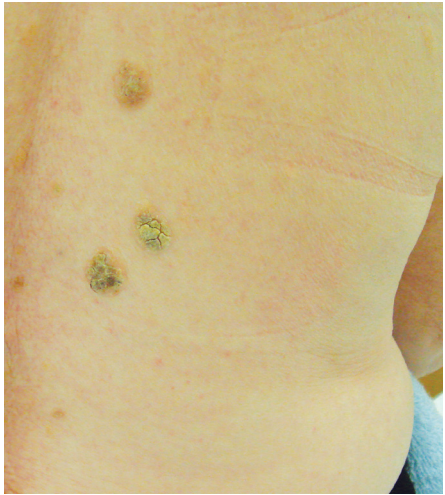
Zapping 'Senile Warts' (Seborrhoeic Keratosis)

'Senile warts' or more accurately, Seborrhoeic Keratoses, are brown crusty spots seen on the skin of adults. Although usually dark brown with a hard crust, occasionally they are flesh coloured or much darker, almost black.



Although harmless they are often seen as unsightly or cosmetically unattractive, and they can irritate and itch.

Historically, they were removed with liquid nitrogen 'Cryotherapy', commonly leaving a scar. However, at Absolute Aesthetics, we use Electrosurgery.



A fine probe with a heat current is used to shave them off of the skin, leaving little or no scar. No anaesthetic is required, and minimal discomfort is experienced during the treatment.
