Mölnlycke Wound Academy Scholarship Awards

Mölnlycke Health Care presented its Wound Academy Scholarships and Awards at a recent lunch held at The Royal Opera House in London.

The annual Scholarships and Awards are a reflection of the Mölnlycke Health Care Wound Academy's commitment to wound care education. They provide health care professionals in the area of wound care with the opportunity for personal and professional development.

This year's winner in the Novice Practitioner category was Gilly Glendewar, Tissue Viability Nurse Specialist at Le Bas Centre in Jersey. The toolkit enables health care professionals to effectively assess and manage radiotherapy skin reactions and select appropriate dressings, which saves time and resources and reduces potential distress to patients.

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A Highly Commended Team Award was presented to the Dudley Diabetes Foot Team for its hybrid model of acute diabetic foot care, which uses a cohesive and fully integrated pathway. The specialist team, based at Russells Hall Hospital and in the community, has focused on the care of wounds in the diabetic foot and also provide a formal programme of foot care education for patients and fellow health care professionals.
